


BOYS



The guy here is so into his move partner that his actions are subconsciously mirroring hers. Note the simultaneous drink sipping. Plus, his head is tilting toward hers, proving that he's happy to be with her. By putting his arm around her gorstly, he's showing his affection (duh). But if he had a tight grip on her, it might imply that he's controlling. The litmus test? Look at how he's crossed his legs. Since the bettern of his foot is pointing away from his date, it means he'd never try to (metaphorically) step on her.



This hoy has get it had. You can tell because he's aiming his chest at her. He's also trying to initiate what Patti calls the "dance of intimacy" (forgive the checeinose), in which girls and guys trade innoceat body contact. "Girls may think it's no hig deal, and that "Maybe be didn't realize he touched my thigh," says Patti. "He knows he touched it." But this boy's shoulder tap isn't working—the girl's crossed arms are a virtual "De not disturb" sign.

Patti cays that when he gives you a genuine smile, his cheeks rise, his eyes crinkle, and his forchead lifts, but not for so long that the expression gets tight. And since he respects this girl, his gaze is focused on her eyes, nose, and mouth, While there's a bit of incidental touching going on, the pair's torses are a respectable distance apart—confirming their platenic love.
